Primary objective

Provide quality specialist advice on, and analysis of, matters considered by the Utilities Commission, which are likely to involve the electricity, ports, and water supply and sewerage industries, including from economic, pricing, financial, compliance, or legal perspectives.

Context statement

The Commission is an independent statutory authority, consisting of a Commissioner and Associate Commissioner. It is responsible for economic regulation of the electricity, water and sewerage industries, declared ports and other industries. It also provides advice to the Government as required on such matters. An office, led by the Director Utilities Commission, supports the Commission, with staff seconded from the Department of Treasury and Finance.

Key duties and responsibilities

- 1. Manage, plan and complete major reviews and projects, including procurement and management of consultants.
- 2. Engage with stakeholders from the community, business, regulated industries and government, and represent the Commission in a variety of forums as necessary.
- 3. Prepare briefings, licences, publications and regulatory codes to a high standard, including developing appropriate recommendations for the Commission.
- 4. Undertake research, analysis and provide advice, on complex issues that may have implications for the Commission and Territory.

Selection criteria

Essential

- 1. Demonstrated experience and knowledge in economic regulation, compliance, economic policy and / or the operations of utility industries.
- 2. Proven conceptual and problem solving skills, high level strategic thinking, analytical, advisory, and research skills.
- 3. Proven project management, procurement and contract management skills.
- 4. Proven high order oral and written communication skills and experience in communicating complex issues in a clear and concise manner, e.g. on economic, financial, compliance, legal and technical issues.
- 5. Demonstrated initiative, high level of motivation and ability to manage competing priorities, meet deadlines, complete tasks to expected standards, and work effectively in a small team environment.
- 6. High level interpersonal skills, including strong stakeholder engagement and negotiation skills.
- 7. An ability to interact effectively with people from diverse cultures.

Desirable

- 1. Tertiary qualification in economics, policy, public administration, law or a similar field.
- 2. A knowledge of the Northern Territory's electricity, water and sewerage, or ports regulatory industries, or the national energy markets.
