# ELECTRICITY PRICING ORDER

I, MICHAEL ANTHONY REED, the Treasurer, in pursuance of section 44 of the *Electricity Reform Act*, for the regulation of prices for the sale of electricity and services to non-contestable customers by the Power and Water Authority, issue an electricity pricing order that –

- (a) on and from 1 July 2000 the prices for the sale of electricity and services by the Power and Water Authority to non-contestable customers are to be the same as the charges fixed under section 30(1) of the *Electricity Act* by the instrument dated 29 March 1999 and published in *Gazette* No. S14 dated 29 March 1999 and as amended by the instrument dated 24 June 1999 and published in *Gazette* No. S30 on 29 June 1999 ("the *Electricity Act* instrument") except that –
  - (i) the price of electricity supplied through a pre-payment meter referred to in clause 2 of Schedule 1 to the *Electricity Act* instrument is to be 14.72 cents per unit of electricity supplied;
  - (ii) the price of electricity resold by a proprietor of a caravan park referred to in clause 8(a) of Schedule 1 to the *Electricity Act* instrument is to be 17.20 cents per unit of electricity supplied;
  - (iii) the price of electricity referred to in item 1(b) of Schedule 3 to the *Electricity Act* instrument is to be 15.00 cents/kWh;
  - (iv) the price of electricity referred to in item 2(b)(i) of Schedule 3 and item 2(b)(i) of Schedule 4 to the *Electricity Act* instrument is to be 19.20 cents/kWh;
  - (v) the price of electricity referred to in items 1(a) and 2(a) of Schedule 4 to the *Electricity Act* instrument is to be 39.69 cents/kWh;
  - (vi) the price of electricity referred to in item 1(b) of Schedule 4 to the *Electricity Act* instrument is to be 15.00 cents/kWh;

- (vii) the price of electricity supplied during peak period and off-period to an account holder who elects or has elected to be charged the Demand Tariff in accordance with clause 9 of Schedule 1 of the *Electricity Act* instrument is, for the purpose of clause 9(3)(a) of that Schedule, to be the amount specified in Column 2 in the Table in Schedule 1 for the level specified opposite in Column 1 of the Table in Schedule 1;
- (viii) the price of electricity supplied during peak period and off-peak period to an account holder who elects or has elected to be charged the Demand Tariff in accordance with clause 9 of Schedule 1 of the *Electricity Act* instrument is, for the purpose of clause 9(3)(b) of that Schedule, to be the amount specified in Column 2 in the Table in Schedule 2 for the level specified opposite in Column 1 of the Table in Schedule 2;
- (ix) the price of electricity supplied to a miscellaneous installation referred to in clause 10(1) of Schedule 1 to the *Electricity Act* instrument and specified in Column 1 in the Table in Schedule 3 is to be the amount specified opposite in Column 2 in the Table in Schedule 3;
- (x) the price for a service referred to in clause 10(4) of Schedule 1 to the *Electricity Act* instrument and specified in Column 1 in the Table in Schedule 4 is to be the amount specified opposite in Column 2 in the Table in Schedule 4; and
- (xi) there is to be a goods and services tax (within the meaning of the A New Tax System (Goods and Services) Act 1999 of the Commonwealth) pass through rate of 8.6953% imposed on all prices for the supply of electricity;
- (b) subject to paragraph (c) the Power and Water Authority must give notice of the prices it will charge for the sale of electricity and services to noncontestable customers in accordance with this order by publishing the prices in the *Gazette*, including specifying in the notice that the prices are effective on and from 1 July 2000;
- (c) the Power and Water Authority must not give notice of the prices referred to in paragraph (b) unless the Utilities Commission approves the prices as complying with paragraph (a); and

(d) the Power and Water Authority must ensure that copies of the prices published under paragraph (b) are available at its offices for inspection and purchase by members of the public,

with effect on the date of this instrument.
