Northern Territory Water Supply and Sewerage Services Industry Licence Fees Schedule Effective from 1 July 2013

Application Fee

Section 15(2) of the *Water Supply and Sewerage Services Act* provides that the applicant must pay to the Utilities Commission an application fee fixed by the Minister of an amount that the Minister considers appropriate to meet the reasonable costs of determining the application.

The following application fees have been approved by the Treasurer with effect from 1 July 2013.

Fee

For application for issue of licence and application to transfer licence	\$1,500
For renewal of licence at expiry	\$1,500

Annual Licence Fees

Section 19(3) of the *Water Supply and Sewerage Services Act* provides the annual licence fee for a licence is the fee fixed from time to time by the Minister in respect of the licence as an amount that the Minister considers to be a reasonable contribution towards administrative costs.

The following application fees have been approved by the Treasurer with effect from 1 July 2013.

Water supply services:

Large provider (supplying services in major urban centres and multiple rural and remote licence areas)	\$25,000
Small provider (supplying services in a single minor urban centre and/or a small number of rural and remote licence areas)	\$ 1,000

Sewerage supply services:

Large provider (supplying services in major urban centres and multiple rural and remote licence areas)	\$25,000
Small provider (supplying services in a single minor urban centre and/or a small number of rural and remote licence areas)	\$ 1,000

Notes:

- (1) The annual fee on all licences granted after commencement of a licence year will be apportioned on the basis of the formula X/Y where:
 - X = the number of days for which the licence fee is payable; and
 - Y = the number of days in the licence year.
- (2) Where a licence commences within 90 days before the commencement of a licence year, the Utilities Commission may choose to calculate a single licence fee for the period until the end of the first full licence year. Any fee payable for a part of a licence year will be calculated in accordance with (1) above.
- (3) No refund of fees, whether in whole or in part, is available on cancellation of a licence or withdrawal of a licence application.
